# NATIONAL RHODESIAN RIDGEBACK COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA BYLAWS

---

## 1) COLOUR SCHEMES AT NATIONALS

*Effective 09 April 2024*

- a) The colour schemes to be used at all National shows must be green and gold. The codes are:
- Name: Cyber Yellow
  - Hex: #FED200
  - RGB: (254, 210, 0)
  - CMYK: 0, 0.173, 1, 0.003
  
  - Name: Deep Moss Green
  - Hex: #2C6A45
  - RGB: (44, 106, 69)
  - CMYK: 0.584, 0, 0.349, 0.584
- b) The Member Club, as defined the NRRC Constitution may not add the Member's Club colours (if any) to the colour scheme for the National Show.
- c) The colour scheme noted in 1. a) above applies to sashes, ribbons, rosettes and any other such awards related items.
- d) Medallions are excluded from the requirements mentioned in point c) above, as colour restrictions do not allow for distinction between places (1st, 2nd etc.)

## 2) FONTS AT NATIONALS

*Effective 09 April 2024*

- a) A Member Club will only use the font known as "NEUE HELVITACA GEORGIAN 75 BOLD" on sashes and ribbons. A sample of the font is shown below for ease of reference.

- b) The lettering / font shall be in GOLD

### **3) USE OF NRRC LOGO**

*Effective 09 April 2024*

- a) It is at the discretion of the Member Club hosting a National whether to incorporate the NRRC logo in any of the awards, advertising materials, booklets, merchandise or any other such items as may be associated with a National, subject to the Member Club seeking written approval from the NRRC prior to using the logo.
- b) The NRRC will provide logo files in formats suitable for use by professional printers and designers and any modification or use of the logo that detracts from the logo is strictly prohibited.
- c) The NRRC logo must be displayed on all sashes, rosettes and ribbons, and a state Club may at their discretion elect to add their logo to these items. Medallions are specifically excluded from this requirement.

### **4) NATIONAL HONOUR ROLL**

*Effective 09 April 2024*

- a) A Member Club hosting a National will, for the duration of the National, display an honour roll of past National Winners.
- b) The cost of the honour roll will be borne by the NRRC, subject to the associated expense being pre-approved in writing by the NRRC.

### **5) INTERNATIONAL JUDGE APPOINTMENTS**

*Effective 09 April 2024*

- a) There is not any prohibition on a state club appointing an international judge in the same year as a National show.

### **6) MOST SUCCESSFUL DAM, SIRE, AND BREEDER**

*Effective 22 October 2024*

- a) When determining the Most successful dam, sire and breeder the Point score will have points allocated for placement positions (1<sup>st</sup> through to 5<sup>th</sup>) with the following points awarded – 1<sup>st</sup> - 5, 2<sup>nd</sup> - 4, 3<sup>rd</sup> - 3, 4<sup>th</sup> - 2 and 5<sup>th</sup> – 1.
- b) The Point score shall be allocated across all Classes including Neuter, which is to be treated as a normal age class.
- c) The Point score for each placement position shall be consistent with that used at the show at which the awards for Most successful dam, Most successful sire, and Most successful breeder are to be determined.

## 7) **CONTRIBUTIONS TOWARDS NATIONALS BY NRRC**

*EFFECTIVE 21 JANUARY 2025*

- a) The NRRC shall contribute \$500 towards the Most Successful Breeder award at a National.
- b) The NRRC shall contribute \$250 towards the Best in Show award at a National.
- c) The contribution shall be applied at the discretion of the host Club but must be utilised towards the awards specified in a) and b) above.
- d) The Australian Dollar value reflected in a) and b) above shall be reviewed every second year, to ensure the value of the contribution is relevant.

## 8) **OUTGOING STATE REPRESENTATIVES**

*EFFECTIVE 21 JANUARY 2025*

- a) The NRRC may, by majority vote elect to invite outgoing state representatives as guests to meetings to facilitate proper handover and ensure continuity of projects.
